

INVENTORY OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH RESPONSES TO HIV & AIDS IN KENYA

Foreword

This INVENTORY of the struggle of the Catholic Church in Kenya against the HIV/AIDS pandemic is a happy and promising event.

The initiative was first occasioned by the 13th International Conference on HIV/AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections in Africa (ICASA) held in Nairobi, 21-26 September 2003. The INVENTORY provided a comprehensive overview of the efforts undertaken by the Church in Kenya to combat the HIV/AIDS pandemic since the beginning. In 2006 the INVENTORY was completely revised and up-dated.

For the funding of this research, its compilation and publication, we would like to thank the following partner agencies: the African Jesuits AIDS Network (AJAN), Caritas Italiana and Catholic Relief Services (CSR) in Kenya.

The information contained in this booklet will help the Church to know better what she is already doing, and what she can do more and better. The DIRECTORY at the end is clearly meant to spark more communication and collaboration among Catholics and their partners in the struggle against the pandemic.

Even though those who prepared this inventory strove for accuracy, they do not pretend to present a total result or an all-inclusive catalogue. This is but another step in grasping the full breadth and depth of the Catholic response to HIV/AIDS in Kenya. All comments both positive and negative as well additional information are welcome and should be sent to KARDS and/or to the Jesuit Hakimani Centre. We thank their staff and assistants for work well done so far. The show of love by Kenyans for their brothers and sisters in need can neither be adequately described nor overemphasized. The scourge of HIV/AIDS in Kenya, however, remains a threat with an uncertain long-term evolution. At the end of the 2005, UNAIDS estimated 6.7 percent HIV-prevalence rate among adults 15-49 years of age. There is hardly room for complacency in this war. One conclusion of this survey is precisely the vital need for more adequate documentation of the Catholic experience with prevention, care treatment, advocacy and support of those infected and affected by HIV/AIDS.

With this inventory, the Kenyan Catholic Church wishes to honor the work of many pastors, priests, religious, men and women who have dedicated themselves with greatest Christian compassion, faith, sensitivity and concern for those infected by HIV/AIDS. "What you do for one of these little ones, you do it for me", says the Lord Jesus Christ.

Introduction

Origins

The occasion for initiating the original Inventory¹ was the 13th International Conference on HIV/AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections in Africa (ICASA) in Nairobi on 21-26 September 2003 with the theme of "Access to Care and its Challenges." Under the auspices of the Kenya Episcopal Conference and its commission on Health and Family Life, representatives of various Catholic AIDS ministries in the Nairobi area began to meet in late May 2003 prepare for ICASA. The Taskforce decided to offer, to ICASA delegates and to visitors from elsewhere in Africa, a realistic picture of how the Church in the host country is responding to HIV/AIDS. The Task of designing and conducting an appropriate survey was entrusted to KARDS and Jesuit Hakimani Centre.

In 2003, preparation for the 13th ICASA, a country-wide survey was made of how the Catholic Church was actually responding to HIV and AIDS in Kenya.

Researchers visited each diocese with simple questionnaires that solicited quantitative responses regarding the kind, scope, outreach and approaches of the Church's HIV and AIDS programs. People working in these initiatives were also queried in a more qualitative way about the history of their place, main objectives they want to achieve, success stories, their main worries and their hopes to their future. Answers from the Dioceses provide a rich sample and a realistic picture of the Churches response to HIV and AIDS in Kenya. Adapting the same methodology, the *Inventory* has been revised and improved.

The Inventory

The current Inventory, expanded and totally updated, will with Gods help, prove useful throughout the Church in Kenya: to appreciate the great efforts done already, to stimulate new creativity and even greater generosity, to facilitate networking – especially with other FBO's in the HIV/AIDS field, and to attract new resources. The results will be completed and corrected in the years ahead. Still, this second edition is just another step, and we hope that the data will be completed and corrected in the years ahead.

Methodology

The work on the Inventory 2006 began end 2005 by consulting with the members of the Kenya Catholic HIV & AIDS Taskforce (K—CHAT) at the Kenya Episcopal Conference – Catholic Secretariat on the objectives, strategies and expected output of this project. The members expected that, building upon the earlier INVENTORY 2003, the survey should:

- Document the struggle of the Catholic Church against HIV/AIDS
- Provide a directory with contact addresses of the Catholic HIV/AIDS programmes and institutions.
- Help the Church to know what she is already doing and can do better.
- Encourage similar initiatives towards a more corporate effort against HIV/AIDS elsewhere in Africa

These and other considerations were incorporated in a survey instrument (a questionnaire) that would make it possible to sketch the different dimensions of the Catholic Church's struggle against the pandemic. The data to be gathered in each Catholic Diocese included qualitative indicators (e.g. the number of participants/beneficiaries of programmes, types of activities, number of personnel involved, the annual average expenses, and the origin of the financial and human resources, and also a more narrative description of the programmes/institutions. Highlighting the purpose, main objectives, past success, the major challenges and the hopes for the future (see questionnaire, below).

Thirty three field researches received their orientation from 30 January to 3RD February 2006.

In this training session the technical aspects of the questionnaire were discussed. Additionally, background information on the pandemic and the medical and pastoral role of the Catholic Church was provided by professional speakers. The orientation included the pre-testing and fine-tuning of the survey instrument in the archdiocese of Nairobi. Soon after, the field researchers were dispatched to twenty five Catholic dioceses in Kenya.

In the field, the researchers sporadically encountered such limitations as the lack of ready data and documentation about the Church's activities as well as uncoordinated efforts. Most researchers enjoyed the cooperation interest and encouragement of the diocesan medical coordinators.

The data were computed and analyzed by Koinonia Advisory Research and Development Services (KARDS), the Jesuit Hakimani Centre and the KEC-CS Health & Family Life Commission.

The preliminary findings were reported to K-CHAT on 13th March 2006 and the final results are presented here.

The situation

We are greatly alarmed by the magnitude of HIV and AIDS, its origin, the conditions of susceptibility to infection and illness, its spread and its consequences. Beginning with devastating statistics, according to UNAIDS,² 25.8 million people out of a total population of 862 million in sub Saharan Africa are living with HIV and AIDS.

A rate of infection above 1% is, by definition an epidemic. Nearly all the countries of the sub Saharan region have a rate well above 1%. The average HIV infection rate among adults aged 15 – 49 in sub Saharan Africa 7.2%. Here in Kenya it is 6.7%. In 2005, about 2.4 million Africans died of AIDS related illnesses; in Kenya there were about 150,000 such deaths in 2001.

Statistics confirm that the AIDS epidemic continues to advance. According to UNAIDS, in spite of the many programmes of prevention and treatment, 55 million Africans are expected to die of AIDS related illnesses between 2000 and 2020.

What is behind the apparently unassailable onslaught of the disease? We have to highlight a long list of powerful contributing factors which make it very hard to combat the epidemic effectively;

- First of all, and most importantly, grinding poverty through out Africa, many situations of injustice and, in many places, conflict and involuntary

displacement. These adverse conditions may not directly cause HIV, but they do make its spread practically inevitable.

- The collapse of education and healthcare systems
- Rampant unemployment
- Poor nutrition
- Alcohol and drug abuse
- Greed and corruption
- Ignorance and prejudice
- Discrimination and stigma
- Lack of respect for children and women
- Destructive sexual behavior
- Damaging practices supported by both traditional and modern cultures.

The impact of the disease itself compounds these difficulties horribly. AIDS does not just kill huge numbers of people; it is wiping out the young generations, those who are working and raising children and supporting families. Children many of them infecting by the virus themselves are orphaned. The epidemic is crippling Kenya's economy and welfare system, devastating the family and overwhelming the extended family that has until now, been giving nearly everyone the essential economic and social supports. AIDS is also weakening the church.

The terrible consequences are too plain to see in every Kenyan city, town village and home, parish and community: untold suffering worsening misery, early deaths, countless orphans and our up – coming generations decimated.

2. The Church Responds

2.1 National Organization and Structures

The Kenya Episcopal Conference

Always conscious of the promise of the Lord, "I am with you until the end of time" (Mt 28:20), the Bishops and Pastors of the Catholic Church in Kenya seek to live the mandate of Christ " you shall be my witness" Acts 1:8 through the instrument of the Kenya Episcopal Conference (KEC). The bishops exercise certain of their offices together as pastors for the benefit of the faithful entrusted to them, and secondly they promote the greater good which the church offers to all peoples by adopting forms and methods of apostolate suitable to Kenya. The conference of Bishops elects a chairman and a vice chairman to preside over the KEC, which also has an elected permanent council charged with the responsibility of implementing the decisions of the conference. Several Bishops serve on an Episcopal AIDS task force looking out for and guiding this paramount, cross cutting theme.

The KEC mandates the catholic secretariat to coordinate through its various commissions and implement all the activities which express the mission of the catholic church in Kenya.

The KEC – Catholic Secretariat

As the national action arm of the KEC, the Kenya Catholic Secretariat (KCS) is the administrative centre through which the KEC implements and coordinates various pastoral programs and undertakes those responsibilities which fulfill the mission of the Catholic Church in Kenya. The Catholic secretariat houses the office of the secretary general of the conference. It carries out the decisions of the Bishops, coordinates the activities of the church, cooperates with the Kenyan Government voluntary agencies and other religious communities, initiates new programmes and services as need arises, and coordinates and manages the national development programmes of the KEC through various commissions.

The KEC – Commissions

A commission is a body constituted by the Episcopal Conference for a specific mission of the church to study, recommend and implement its findings subject to the approval of the competent authority as pastoral needs arise. The secretary general's office provides oversight and coordination of the commissions. Among the fifteen current ones is the commission on Health and family life.

Commission on Health and Family Life

Established in 1957 as the medical department to coordinate mission hospitals, the commission on health and family life was further enshrined in the statutes in 1997 to help the KEC live out the mandate of Christ – “You shall be my witness” with particular reference to his healing ministry – through the provision of health services. Because of bio ethical issues and increasing challenges to the family, the family life department was brought under commission.

The role of the commission for Health and Family Life is to facilitate national coordination of the management of Catholic Health Institutions, Community Based Healthcare Systems, Family Life Programmes, and AIDS – related programmes in various dioceses and to provide leadership on tackling emerging challenges facing the KEC and the Catholic Health Services.

The Kenya Catholic Church's HIV and AIDS Taskforce

The Kenya Catholic Church's HIV and AIDS Taskforce (K – CHAT) began in May 2003 as a means of preparing for the 13th ICASA in Nairobi and since then it has been providing a forum for networking among catholic groups involved in AIDS ministry in Kenya and for mainstreaming AIDS efforts in the church.

Within the KEC structure, K – CHAT relates to the commission for Health and Family life, whose staff represent the KEC on the taskforce. Functioning as a coalition or consortium of voluntary associates, K – CHAT is catholic in its conception, vision and membership and, on this basis, is happy to work with others actively involved in the struggle against HIV and AIDS in Kenya.

2.2. Diocesan Health Institutions

Health Management at the Diocesan Level

The administration and organization of health services in catholic health institutions in Kenya differ from one diocese to another and even from one institution to another, for historical, geographical, local and health reasons; nevertheless, they aspire to similarity.

The legal and moral responsibility for all catholic health units belongs to the diocese. The bishop of the diocese is the primary owner of these institutions and is ultimately responsible for them. Therefore diocesan health boards and hospital government boards, because they represent ownership and management, do not usually include government agents in their composition. However, membership of the advisory committees can include a broad range of people from the local community, parish, private and public sectors.

The Diocesan Health Coordinator is the key position within the diocese for coordination and communication. The coordinator is in close communication with the commission for health and family life and is a member of the Diocesan Health Board and the Government Board. The health centres and dispensaries are answerable to the Bishop and the KCS through the diocesan health coordinator.

The Diocesan Health Coordinator keeps the commission for Health informed of major events, developments and difficulties, and also makes sure that information passes from the commission to the health units within the jurisdiction.

3. The Church Acts

3.1. The Starting Point

The Catholic Church's starting point is compassion in a context of great need. In response, initiatives of quite varied sorts were launched, usually as spontaneous responses to a need as perceived and arising out of HIV and AIDS.

- Ø The first striking feature is that AIDS ministers everywhere feel overwhelmed by the sheer numbers in need of assistance. Whereas national prevalence rates may go down and one reads about "success stories" in Kenya, the daily experience of administrators, workers and volunteers on the ground can be frustrating. Service providers feel they cannot respond, as they would

like to a growing volume of situations and individual cases that seek assistance. Again and again, people talk about the struggle to enhance their capacity, to intensify their efforts, to increase the number of beneficiaries and participants.

- Ø In certain regions of Kenya especially the most remote ones, the Catholic Church is the only solace for the local population. In districts like Trans Mara, for example, the catholic hospital of St. Joseph Kilgoris (Ng'ong Diocese) is the only facility within a radius of 100km. The church wants to keep this hospital operational in spite of serious financial difficulties. An estimated 40% (2006) of all catholic programmes in Kenya operate in this kind of isolated settings and/ or are providing a particular service no one else around is providing. Generally the church cannot be said to duplicate the efforts of others.
- Ø Community based and individual initiatives sometimes approach the church expecting some assistance or patronage. Apart from financial help, the church is asked to provide guidance in administrative and financial matters. This results in a partnership with the church that can take many forms. Certain works have been completely taken over by the church and are now known as church – run programmes, but they actually started as a private initiative or as a spontaneous effort undertaken by a group within the local community.
- Ø Most church based programmes, however started as initiatives by the local Bishop, Priests, Religious, and other Church personnel.
- Ø The church also seizes on unexpected opportunities in creative ways. For example, following a seminar on AIDS, an emerging youth group started offering help in the neighborhood, and the effort subsequently turned in to a well structured home based care programme. Another example; multiple deaths within a catholic women's association made its members reflect, and this triggered a response that grew into an important self help programme for the affected.
- Ø Religious congregations already involved in health care, education and other social services increasingly include AIDS as a priority or an overall dimension in their work.
- Ø Over the years, existing AIDS initiatives like diocesan health departments, or run down diocesan health centers, have increased their capacity, expanded and adapted their approaches, to respond more effectively to the manifold challenges associated with the pandemic.
- Ø Most respondents express the desire to deliver quality service. There is a general perception that this struggle can only be won by professional expertise, by well trained, qualified, experienced and committed personnel. Apart from the obvious need for medical staff, people are talking about an entire range of service providers from counselors and educators to agronomists, water managers, financial administrators and lawyers.

Certain programmes of the Catholic Church in Kenya were donor – initiated and sometimes run by these funding agencies. Additionally, the government of Kenya has

a record of providing advice and encouragement in the starting up of a number of church projects and institutions.

3.2. Where is the Church?

The Catholic Church was among the first to respond to a disease that eventually came to be known as HIV and AIDS. It has done so with a growing number of programmes countrywide but especially among the poor and in the most remote areas. The scope of the services includes the medical, the material and the psycho – spiritual needs of PLWHA and affected groups, together with prevention and advocacy.

In the struggle against HIV and AIDS, health care seems to come first. The Catholic Church in Kenya provides 40% of all health care service in the country. This figure was floated by the government of Kenya a couple of years ago and is probably still an underestimate. Reasons for this significant proportion include:

- Ø While the government's runs about 11,000 health facilities and the Catholic Church manages 411 (see figures below), the quality of government health institutions in Kenya has dramatically deteriorated since the mid – 1980's. For instance, quite a few government hospitals operate, if at all, at the level of health units.
- Ø The Catholic Church operates in regions where the government of Kenya is absent or no longer present. This includes remote areas which are difficult to police and administration. The church in Kenya reaches out in the poorest and most forgotten districts. In arid and marginal parts of the country, the dioceses of Maralal, Marsabit and Ngo'ng run health facilities which is the sole succour of the local population for miles around. The Catholic Church is equally penetrating and settling in the most uninviting urban slums.

Total Number of Facilities Coordinated by the KEC – CS,

The outreach of a catholic hospital goes far beyond the confines of the institution itself. Usually, such hospitals are the centre of a network of dependent dispensaries, health centers and mobile clinics that cover the most abandoned parts of the country. In 2005, the commission for health and family life coordinated a total of 463 health facilities.

The Catholic Church provides 57 PMTCT programmes in mission health facilities in partnership with the catholic medical mission board (CMMB), and 39 in partnership with NASCOP, MEDS and others.

Ten health facilities provide subsidized antiretroviral drugs in partnership with the CRS led consortium and 27 health facilities to do this through NASCOP, Family Health International and MEDS.

Other statistical evidence includes the following:

The community based healthcare workers (15,916 trained in 2004) are a significant army in the struggle against HIV and AIDS, especially in terms of awareness – raising in community based programmes across the country. The impressiveness of such a high number, however needs to be tempered by an observed high turnover of personnel; hence the need to increase the number of trainees every year.

20 out of 41 hospitals offer anti retroviral treatment free or at a subsidized fee. Over 5,000 patients receive medication through these programmes.

The intended figure is between 15000 and 20,000 in order to complement the government's efforts to reach 90,000 needy people by the end of 2006.

Most catholic health institutions report with pride their ability to offer ARV therapy. Though one may question the sustainability of some of these programmes, the general enthusiasm is understandable: ARVs provide not only relief to the patient but also a sense of achievement to the care giver.

Catholic medical institutions offer training to teachers in the catholic school system about care and support of HIV – infected and AIDS affected students. Too often, however, pupils who take care of the household in the morning because their parents live with HIV are punished by (well intended but ill informed) teachers for coming late to school or being tired in class.

Moreover, catholic health facilities assist the most destitute groups in the population by unconditional acceptance of in patients, sometimes waving bills for over 50% of the terminal stages of AIDS and assisting in meeting funeral costs.³

Out of the 573 documented prevention programmes, the number of voluntary counseling and testing (VCT) facilities (15%) and country wide awareness programmes in parishes (17%) and schools (14%) lead the effort in this field. It appears the church makes optimal use of its educational and pastoral infrastructure. Although the number of organizations engaged in research and publication is relatively small, their output reaches the larger population. Apart from strictly medical care and nutrition programmes, the church is at its best in offering psycho social and spiritual support to the PLWH.

Exactly the same can be said about the care of persons with AIDS in the last stages and the care for the affected, especially the OVCs as well as the ongoing support given to the care givers. Over one third of the respondents (36%) maintain they do tackle the basic questions of life in their interaction with patients.

For every member of staff employed by the church in an HIV and AIDS programme, ten volunteers are working side by side.

Over half of the programmes run on an annual budget that exceeds KES two million (USD 27,400). Most programmes run for almost one third on the basis of local contributions (30%) followed by catholic or catholic related funding.

3.3 Key Approaches.

Though most works in the church are usually the fruit of the individual or parochial initiatives, catholic services are moving markedly towards an integrated/ multifaceted approach and towards greater collaboration/ networking with others. Cooperation with partners within and outside the church needs greater emphasis, with some guidelines on whom the church prefers to work with.

Collaboration.

Overwhelmed by the scope and numbers, the Catholic Church is reaching out and working together with other institutions and communities to;

- § Pool resources
- § Share lessons learnt
- § Scout for new talent (e.g. among people with HIV or AIDS, involving them as participants and not just victims.
- § Increase the efficiency, capacity, and safety of measures already in place;
- § Build up and strengthen communities (38% of catholic AIDS programmes have this component)
- § Pay greater attention to follow up and sustainability

traumatic family event. Such generosity is an undocumented witness of respect for the God given dignity of every human life.

- § Speak out on behalf of the infected and the affected in an approach of human rights advocacy
- § Engage in efforts with a multiplier effect (e.g. training of trainers programmes), without forgetting the personal touch through home visits and face to face encounters where attention can be given to the deepest (psychosocial, spiritual) human needs using inventive ways of praying and staying together with therapeutic effect.

Multifaceted and Integrated Approach

Generally, more and more church institutions (especially at Diocesan level) like to conceptualize integrated programmes that mainstream HIV and AIDS in all their undertakings. There is a considered effort to respond to the multifaceted aspect of the pandemic. The church realizes that the struggle against AIDS is cross – sectoral and must go well beyond services of medical care and quick – fix relief.

The catholic educational sector in Kenya is fully engaged in the struggle against HIV. The church provides 45% of all formal education in Kenya (estimated figure 2002). The church reaches out to the most marginal areas like in the Dioceses of Lodwar, Maralal, Kitale (West Pokot) and Ng’ong where the government of Kenya only maintains a minimal presence in the educational field.

The resolve of the church’s educational sector to engage in the struggle against HIV and AIDS is prompted by the alarming degree to which Kenya’s formal education is affected by the pandemic in manifold and complex ways.⁴ To deal with the problem, the ministry of education has launched its Kenya Education Sector Support Programme 2005 – 2010.

The renewed partnership between the government of Kenya and catholic schools may see the introduction of two Catholic Church initiated behavior change programmes into the national curriculum:

- a) The Peace Education Program⁵ and
- b) The abstinence and Behavior for Youth (ABY) programme. The ABY programme targets pupils from standard seven (14 years of age) up to form IV (18 – 19 years of age). A non examinable, non academic subject, this programme is attitude oriented and teaches or transmits life skills and values.

We know of 17 Dioceses and at least one religious congregation that has come up with a comprehensive AIDS programme or policy or an integrated community

⁴ Every month the formal education system in Kenya loses 4 or 5 teachers due to AIDS. Absenteeism of teachers living with HIV+ teachers lose credibility. Such teachers themselves often suffer the loss of authority in front of their students. HIV and AIDS also cause high rates of student drop out and non completion.

⁵ The introduction of the peace education programme in schools is prompted by violent riots (with loss of life) in secondary schools in 2001 – 2002. the peace program also wants to promote alternatives to corporal punishment of children, a practice which is outlawed but still culturally deep rooted.

development plan that mainstreams HIV and AIDS. About 26% of the respondents opted for this approach. Such programmes attempt to merge most of the following aspects into a single concerted effort:

- § Prevention programmes that reach several million Kenyans. Prominent is the Education for Life (EFL) approach adapted countrywide, and behavioral change programmes targeting youth and women.
- § Use of media, catholic media houses like Pauline Publications Africa and New People distribute educational and other materials about HIV and AIDS. Local media and publications at diocesan and parish levels take the struggle against HIV as a priority and key point of reference.
- § Programmes of home based care with trained volunteer healthcare workers at deanery, parish and small Christian community (SCC) levels.
- § In addition to VCT facilities, other counseling programmes like peer counseling or alcohol and drug counseling.
- § Prayer and spiritual accompaniment for infected, affected and those who take care of them.
- § The care of AIDS orphans, OVCs and other affected or vulnerable groups
- § Support groups and income generating activities for people living with HIV or AIDS.
- § Improved nutrition and agriculture
- § Water and sanitation
- § Community building, peace and reconciliation programmes dealing with the conflict and violence that fuel the spread of HIV.
- § Networking with other organizations and institutions to share information and pool efforts
- § Advocacy, the catholic Bishops have been instrumental in transforming some political, economic, social and cultural factors that rendered Kenyans vulnerable to HIV.

What is presently happening at the ground level can be summarized with the expression: "coming together to work more effectively".

3.4 Challenges

Today's caregivers encounter the following obstacles and have the following worries:

- i. Almost everywhere, people worry about the lack of resources and infrastructure. This is clearly worry number one. Many think massive funding is needed and are dismayed to see how certain donors give piecemeal, want to see immediate results and demand more and more time consuming financial and narrative reports.
- ii. Persistent Stigma, stigma is caused by shame for one's past behavior associated with HIV and by fear of the consequences. People keep silent to avoid being excluded from the family, cast off by the neighborhood and discriminated in the workplace. Even AIDS orphans are reportedly rejected by their own family. Most caregivers feel powerless and find this a very hard issue to crack.

- iii. Poverty, frustration is widespread concerning the general situation of poverty and inequity in the country. Ingrained dependency on free handouts was mentioned as the greatest obstacle in the fight against HIV.
- iv. Myths about AIDS

What one could call “the new myths” are repeatedly reported, showing how ignorance, denial, and harmful cultural beliefs continue to breed destructive practices. Some are deep seated attitudes one does not see changing overnight.

- v. Turnover of Care Givers, both volunteers and employed staff pull out quickly. The high turn over of trainees obviously raises the number and costs of the ongoing training efforts. One reason often reported for pulling out is the general view that, even as a volunteer, one is entitled to some form of remuneration or financial incentive. A deeper reason perhaps is the emotional stress associated with AIDS service. To deal with the latter, people feel that the church has to invest more in the accompaniment (treatment) of the care giver: everyone needs some kind of ministry and support. AIDS is our problem, people say, and we are all “wounded healers” (Henry Nouwen)
- vi. Complaints about local administration and Government - In spite of occasional assistance in terms of finances (public harambee, public money, national funds) and other resources, certain church institutions express frustration with the local bureaucracy. Cases include red tape (e.g. in obtaining title deeds, registrations and permission) and corruption. But especially in remote areas where the government appears to exercise less administrative oversight, church personnel continue to complain about harassment, criminal behavior and the lack of a government’s response.⁶ Such an environment, people argue hampers our struggle against HIV and AIDS and fuels the pandemic
- vii. Addictions, people who care about the pandemic are perplexed by addictive behavior, especially among the youth. Some watch rather helplessly as addictions fuel the pandemic; others who know how to deal with addiction complain about the lack of resources. Efforts on a much larger scale are demanded to break the vicious circle of a dysfunctional society, compulsive behavior and substance abuse.
- viii. Children rights, a few gave particular attention to the rights of the children, both boys and girls. They find Kenyan society very insensitive towards minors. Teachers, for instance, punish late comers without even wondering whether the pupil had to get up early to care for sick parents or younger siblings. The trauma of child or adolescent in charge of a family is, above all, a pastoral issue the church needs to focus on more.
- ix. Linked to previous concern, a few find that pastoral (psychosocial and spiritual) care is still underdeveloped. They wonder whether this may be linked to stigma, denial and taboos that persist inside and outside the church,

making both clergy and lay people fearful of ministering in the AIDS field. Fortunately we are seeing some creative initiatives breaking through.

People look to the future with realistic expectations. Most express themselves rather cautiously with phrases conditioned by "if" statements; for example, "of course we would carry on if only we could get a bit more funding". Nevertheless, people continue to cherish great hopes based upon certain achievements in the past. In spite of lacking resources, almost all are grateful for the actual generosity of so many people encountered in the local communities they serve. Above all, an enduring belief in human talent, goodwill, resilience and God's grace keeps everyone going.

Conclusion

In conclusion,⁷ the church is carrying out her mission in response to the HIV pandemic at many levels. As bishops we recognize and appreciate the impressive efforts made by many Dioceses, parishes, congregations and the faithful in responding generously, often under difficult circumstances.

We join Pope John Paul II of venerable memory in recalling "with admiration the many health care workers, chaplains with AIDS and care for their relatives. In this regard, the service of the thousands of catholic health care institutions that go to the help of people in Africa afflicted by every kind of illness, and especially by AIDS, malaria and tuberculosis, is invaluable".⁸

We appreciate, thank and bless the clergy, the religious and the faithful involved in the ministry of the sick, in education and formation of youth, in pastoral duties and home based care, in project large and small.

We appreciate the efforts being made in HIV and AIDS programmes by government and non governmental institutions when they encourage abstinence and fidelity as well as care for people living with HIV and AIDS.

We honor the many families, widows, widowers and communities taking holistic care of their sick with much love and sacrifice. We thank the families and institutions who care for orphans.

We applaud the efforts made by Kenyan medical personnel, both modern and traditional, in treating and caring for people living with HIV and AIDS; and by the counselors who give hope to the infected.

We whole heartedly support the involvement of conscientious parents, teachers, and religious leaders who take to heart the instruction and moral formation of children, youth and communities.
